The McMahon Auditorium Authority, in collaboration with the City of Lawton Arts and Humanities Division, The City of Lawton, and Cameron University, is excited to announce the launch of the new series theme of Let's Talk About It, "The Oklahoma Experience: Looking For Home."

Let's Talk About It is a four-part scholar-led discussion group that brings books to life and encourages thought-provoking discussions. This series is made possible through funding from the National Endowment for the Humanities and aims to explore the literary response to the social changes of that era.

The series continues on Thursday, May 16, at 6:00 p.m. with the reading of Bound for Glory by Woody Guthrie. The discussion will be led by Cameron University Professor Dr. William Carney in the Cameron University Buddy Green Room.

Ethiopian Artist Gebre Kristos Desta



On Monday, April 29, Dr. Kate Cowcher from the University of St. Andrews visited Lawton, Oklahoma, to uncover the life of Gebre Kristos Desta, a renowned Ethiopian artist and refugee.

With the assistance from the City of Lawton Arts and Humanities Division and the Museum of the Great Plains, Dr. Cowcher revealed a vibrant side to his time in Lawton, where he engaged with the community through festivals, workshops, and exhibitions.

It was discovered that the City of Lawton possibly owns one of Desta's last works—a unique oil lamp painting now residing at the Museum of the Great Plains.
